Indonesian Business, Law & Society Program (IBLS)

Gain an understanding of business, law and society with an Indonesian perspective

What is ACICIS?

The Australian Consortium for 'In-Country' Indonesian Studies (ACICIS) is the longest running provider of in-country Indonesian study programs for Australian university students and the primary mechanism through which Australian students pursue study in Indonesia for academic credit.

From small beginnings as a facilitator of accredited in-country Indonesian language study, ACICIS' program offerings have grown to include six-week and semester-long professional practicum programs in a range of disciplines, including journalism, development, agriculture, business, law and international relations.

ACICIS is a consortium of twenty-five Australian member universities (including all of the Group of Eight) as well as overseas centres-of-excellence in the field of Indonesian and Southeast Asian Studies, such as SOAS at Leiden University and the University of London.

Stakeholder Input

With the support of the Australian Government's New Colombo Plan, this program has recently undergone a redesign and expansion.

ACICIS has received over \$420,000 to support up to 72 students to undertake the program between 2018 and 2021. Twelve ACICIS-member universities – Charles Darwin University, Monash University, Murdoch University, RMIT University, UNSW Australia, Flinders University, The University of Adelaide, The University of Western Australia, The University of Melbourne, University of the Sunshine Coast, The Australian National University, and University of Technology Sydney - have received NCP funding to support student participation in this program.

To help develop the program, ACICIS continues to evaluate the IBLS program components and assessments to ensure the program meets the needs of consortium members.

What is the IBLS?

A semester-long program hosted by the Islamic University of Indonesia (UII), Yogyakarta. Taught in English, this program provides students with a comprehensive understanding of Indonesian business, law and society at regional and global levels, as seen from an Indonesian perspective, while developing necessary critical skills to enter their respective fields.

The IBLS also offers students the option to undertake a 'professional placement', enabling students to put their studies into practice and gain a real-world experience outside the classroom. Students are placed with local commercial firms, community-based organisations, government bodies, and non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and are given the opportunity to develop important skills in legal advocacy, public relations, administration, finance, research and reporting.

Industry Sponsors
