



For Bachelor of Communication (Journalism) students only: ACICIS' Short-Term Programs: Application, Registration and Approval

Before applying, please consider the following:

- ✓ You must apply separately to both ACICIS and RMIT University through the respective application forms outlined in detail below.
- ✓ You must be accepted by RMIT University on Mobi to confirm academic credit and any funding eligibility (including New Colombo Plan funding).

Fees & Enrolment

- ACICIS will invoice <u>you</u> directly for the <u>administration and tuition fee</u> these <u>cannot</u> be deferred to HECS.
- You can receive up to 24 credit points towards RMIT electives for the successful completion of the Journalism Professional Practicum.
- RMIT will instruct you to enroll into fee-free course codes before you depart to Indonesia.

New Colombo Plan Mobility Grant

There is no separate application for a \$3,000 New Colombo Plan Mobility Grant – instead, ACICIS will automatically consider you for a grant when you submit your program application to ACICIS. ACICIS will assess your eligibility in collaboration with RMIT upon your acceptance into the program.







For Bachelor of Communication (Journalism) students only: ACICIS' Short-Term Programs: Application, Registration and Approval

You must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- ✓ Current undergraduate (Bachelor or Honours Degree) student
- ✓ Studying at an <u>ACICIS Member University</u> (YES! RMIT is a Member University)
- ✓ Australian citizen
- ✓ Receiving credit towards your degree for participation in this program
- ✓ Have not previously received two virtual short-term New Colombo Plan Mobility Grant*
- ✓ Not currently a citizen or permanent resident of the Republic of Indonesia
- ✓ Not *previously* a citizen or permanent resident of the Republic of Indonesia

N.B. 70% of grant recipients (Australia-wide) must be between the ages of 18-28.

Application process

Step 1: RMIT School Approval.

- Check with your Year Level Advisor whether you can receive credit for the Journalism Professional Practicum.
- ✓ Confirm approval by getting a study plan signed.



^{*}Students are only allowed to receive <u>two virtual short-term</u> NCP grants in addition to <u>one</u> short term mobility grant and <u>one</u> semester-long in-country mobility grant from the New Colombo Plan.

Step 2: Submit your application to ACICIS Study Indonesia.

- ✓ Whilst your study plan is being approved, complete and submit the ACICIS <u>online application</u> for the Journalism Professional Practicum by the deadline.
- ✓ ACICIS will notify students on the outcome of their application approximately one month after the application deadline.

Step 3: Submit your registration through RMIT's Mobi

- ✓ Once you have applied to ACICIS, begin your RMIT Mobi registration for the <u>Journalism</u> <u>Professional Practicum</u>.

Step 5: Enrol in RMIT units

- ✓ Once **both** RMIT and ACICIS have approved your study on the program, you will need to enrol in the appropriate units according to your approved study plan.
- ✓ RMIT will provide information about how to do this.
