### 2. Subject Description

The Law of Government Inspection is a required subject and part of the group of Administrative Law Department. The material of this subject includes: the relationship between law and inspection; introduction to inspection law; inspection authorities in Indonesia; legal instruments of government inspection; and inspection mechanism.

Subject of Law of Government Inspection in the Study Program, Faculty of Law, Islamic University of Indonesia year 2017, given to students in the 2nd (second) semester with 2 (two) credits. This subject has no prerequisites. The aim of the subject is to support the learning outcome for graduates (CPL) in form of ability to understand the basic knowledge of law of government inspection; inspection authorities in Indonesia; legal instruments of government inspection; and government inspection mechanism.

Previously based on 2002 Curriculum, Administrative Law subject was changed to the name of Public Policy Law. Then, in 2008 it changed to be Law of Government Inspection. Students who participates this subject could receive basic modality after graduating from the law school.
