Course Description	This course aims to provide knowledge about the role and politics of CSOs in influencing global issues, especially Sustainable Development (SDGs). Students are introduced to community problems related to poverty-marginalization and SDGs issues in the daily lives and politics of CSOs to overcome these problems. Students are expected to be able to analyse SDGs problems in society and design activities to respond to these problems in the form of community service activities.
