2. Course Description

The Regional and Urban Economic Theory course discusses the economy in a regional context. This course covers the scope of microeconomics, which is about where production activities will be carried out, and also discusses the economy in a macro or regional (regional) context. Differences in the resources and capabilities of an area will affect the level of development of that area and the surrounding areas. In addition, regional development planning and policies of regional development are necessary to achieve optimal development of a region. Urban as a specific area, will also be an important discussion in this course. The characteristics of a city cannot be separated from the context of how the urban area grows. Various urban problems such as housing problems, transportation and urban poverty are also part of the problems that will be discussed in this course. Apart from that, in this course students will also be introduced to various analytical tools in conducting research in the field of regional and urban economics.
