Course Description	This course aims to facilitate students to develop their potential both as analysts and practitioners related to the role of international organizations. To develop their competence as analysts, students study the classification and role of international organizations. This analytical ability will be tested by the accuracy of the analysis capturing relatively precisely and on the basis of this analysis, students can evaluate the implementation of the role of international organizations in overcoming certain global problems. Practitioner competence is facilitated by the development of new programs by international organizations to address specific international problems. To develop the competency of analysts and practitioners, students will understand the history, classification, roles and functions and decision-making processes in international organizations, as well as theories that can become an analytical framework.
